

The Holiday Cacti and Cyclamen are great alternatives to the traditional poinsettia. These plants offer colorful holiday blooms, plus you can enjoy them all year 'round.

The Holiday Cactus, also known as the Thanksgiving Cactus or the Christmas Cactus, can be bought during the holiday season

in bloom. It should be placed in indirect sunlight, in regular indoor temperatures. Keep the soil moist and fertilize weekly.

Cyclamen, available in white, red, and deep pink, generally are dormant during summer months and bloom indoors during winter. Be sure to

It is a species of flowering plant that is endemic to the island of Saint Helena in the southern Atlantic Ocean. It is not related to the ebony of commerce (Diospyros spp.), but is instead a member of the mallow family, Malvaceae. Saint Helena ebony is now critically endangered in the wild. How about that, a critically endangered plant growing happily and beautifully in La Jolla! •

smell Cyclamen 'Absolu de Morel', the perfume fragrance and white with magenta tipped blooms are an intoxicating combination.

Editor's Note: Here are some WAN picks for the holidays!

Rosemary

Not just for the holiday season, plant this in the yard and have year-round access to a fresh herb. Make this a gift that keeps on giving.

Mini Christmas Trees

These are fun, easy to care for, and can be planted in the yard for year-round enjoyment. They are usually decorated and wrapped in decorative foil. Remove the foil to water and make sure the plant drains thoroughly before returning it to its decorative sleeve.

Ivy Topiaries

An instant formal look is achieved with these. They are fast growing and easy to maintain. Keep in bright light and keep soil moist. Snip wayward new growth or wind into existing foliage to maintain the shape.

Ken Andersen recommends Phalaenopsis because they are so easy to grow. Also called **Moth** Orchids, they tolerate low light and usually need weekly watering.

Bulbs

Don't forget Paperwhites and Amaryllis. If you are getting a late start with these, you can find them already potted up!

Poinsettias

The selection is huge and no longer limited to the traditional finds. Look for really white varieties (not yellow being sold as white), hot pink, lime green, striped, spotted, and gold. Some may even have glitter but that is just sprinkled magic and not nature.

few new ones that made their 2025 debut to tell you about.

Angelic Veil (Hybrid Tea)

Fusion of pink and white picotee hues, with a citrus-infused, moderately fruity aroma. Grows to a height of 2½-6' and spreading out 2-3'. It offers robust resistance against powdery mildew and rust.

Tiamo (Hybrid Tea)

Non-fading red blooms that thrive in hot summers. With its lovely mild fragrance and stunning color, this rose is ideal for cutting while its bushy upright habit (5½' tall x 3' wide) and hardy nature make it perfect for many garden settings.

Time After Time

Floribunda rose with medium pink color and slightly fruity scent. This rose variety reaches a height of 2-5', spreading over 2-4'. It has robust

disease resistance, particularly against powdery mildew and rust.


The oldest rose we have is **Zepherine Drouhin**, a pink climbing rose, which was introduced in 1868!! Several 2024 roses are back in stock so if you missed seeing them last year, 2025 might be your lucky year.

We brought a few in, they are a good-looking plant, but be warned that they are darn hard to grow, in fact wasabi, native to Japan, is considered to be one of the most difficult. Big, green leaves trail and are topped with a tiny, white flower. The flower reminds me of a spider plant flower.

When researching how to grow wasabi, I came across words like "with the proper care and environment', "14 steps to

Funny Things In Nature

If a holly plant's leaves are being nibbled by deer, it switches on genes that make the leaves spiky when they regrow. On taller hollies, the upper leaves (safely out of deer's reach) are smooth while the lower leaves are prickly! It's true, plants can communicate with each other through chemical signals.



During the 1600s in Holland, tulips were so valuable that their bulbs were worth more than gold. The craze was called tulip mania, or tulipomania, and caused the crash of the Dutch economy. Fun fact about tulips: After cutting tulips, they can continue to grow as much as an inch per day.

The word **pineapple** comes from European explorers who thought the fruit combined the look of a pinecone with flesh similar to an apple. Pineapples are the only edible members of the bromeliad family.

Small pockets of air inside **cranberries** cause them to bounce and float in water.

Algae are among Earth's oldest forms of life, with fossils dating back over 3 billion years.



So sorry we didn't learn this fact until after Halloween: The giant montane pitcher plant of Borneo is large enough to digest rats. Its size and the digestive fluid it produces allow it to tackle much larger prey than the average insect-eating plant.

Venus Flytraps are just the tip of the carnivorous plant iceberg. There are over 600 different types of plants that prefer their meals winged or crawling. The Venus Flytrap keeps count of how many times an insect touches its hair triggers before closing shut.

And, finally a really mean fact: Tomato plants can be pretty ruthless. When a sibling plant is struggling, they'll release more chemicals into the ground to inhibit their sibling's growth and reduce competition.

growing" and 'challenging'. Given that, I will keep buying wasabi in the tube or use the powered version. However, if you are up for it, here are growing tips.

It requires a humid, temperate environment (you may need a greenhouse), takes two years to mature, and is highly susceptible to disease when grown in large quantities. Provide shade as wasabi is not a sun loving plant. Plant in compost amended with an organic, sulfur-rich fertilizer. The soil pH should be between 6 and 7. Keep plant moist but the soil should be well draining. It's a semi-aquatic plant which makes it susceptible to mold and disease. The distinctive flavor develops when the plant matures at 24 months. Once mature, dig up the rhizome, which should be 7-8 inches long.

There you have it. See you at the supermarket buying wasabi?? •
